Chris is a Fellow of the IAG, a Fellow and current president of the Australian Institute of Navigation, and a Fellow of the U.S. Institute of Navigation. Chris has been researching the technology and applications of GPS and other positioning systems for over three decades, and is an author or co-author of over 650 journal and conference papers.
