Professor BATTY Michael

Michael Batty is a Distinguished Chair Professor at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He is also Bartlett Professor of Planning and Chairman of the Centre for Advanced Spatial Analysis at University College London and a Fellow of the Royal Society and the British Academy.

He received his BA degree from The University of Manchester in Town and Country Planning in 1966 and his PhD in Architecture from the University of Wales in 1984. He has worked on computer models of cities and their visualisation since the 1970s and has published several books, such as **Cities and Complexity** (2005), **The New Science of Cities** (2013) and **Inventing Future Cities** (2018) all MIT Press. Prior to his current position, he was Professor of City Planning and Dean of the School of Environmental Design at the University of Wales at Cardiff from 1979 to 1990 and then Director of the National Center for Geographic Information and Analysis at the State University of New York at Buffalo from 1990 to 1995. He was awarded the CBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours in 2004 and the 2013 recipient of the Lauréat Prix International de Géographie Vautrin Lud. In 2015 he received the Gold Medal of the Royal Geographical Society and in 2016 the Gold Medal of the Royal Town Planning Institute.
