Biography

Prof. Chris Rizos is Professor of Geodesy and Navigation at the University of New South Wales, Sydney, Australia. Chris is the immediate Past President of the International Association of Geodesy (IAG), a member of the Governing Board of the International GNSS Service (IGS), and a member of the Bureau of the International Union of Geodesy & Geophysics (IUGG). Chris is a Fellow of the IAG, a Fellow and current president of the Australian Institute of Navigation, and a Fellow of the U.S. Institute of Navigation. Chris has been researching the technology and applications of GPS and other positioning systems for over three decades, and is an author or co-author of over 650 journal and conference papers.

He has published two monographs, three coauthored monographs and more than 300 papers. His main research field includes geodetic data processing, navigation and geodetic coordinate system etc.
